SUWA is made up of people like you — concerned people from Utah and throughout the nation who share the common goal of preserving Utah's remaining desert wild lands, known collectively as America's redrock wilderness.

This is a great opportunity to gain valuable experience into the day-to-day functions of non-profit grassroots organizing with one of the country's leading conservation campaigns. The experience offers insight into environmental campaign planning, education, organizing and activism.

The Southern Utah Wilderness Alliance (SUWA) seeks a summer/fall intern to support grassroots organizing among Latinx communities in Utah. The organizing intern will work with the SUWA Latinx Community Organizer.



TIMELINE & COMPENSATION

This is a four-month, 100-hour internship from mid June to September. Weekly work hours will average 8 hours a week but rise to a maximum of 30 hours on Latino Conservation Week, which occurs from Sep 14th to 22nd.

The intern will be paid \$2000 for the entirety of the internship in monthly installments. This equates to \$20.00 an hour.

LOCATION

The internship will be based in Salt Lake City at SUWA's headquarter office at 425 E 100 S. with travel throughout the valley, across the Wasatch Front, and Southern Utah, if needed.

Access to reliable transportation and ability to transport materials is required.

- Represent SUWA at community events and festivals.
- Organize, promote, and execute a Latino Conservation Week event that advances the protection of redrock wilderness.
- Inform community members about redrock wilderness issues.
